

Dr. James Wesley Quillin

August 2, 1949 - May 25, 2021

The Rite of Burial of the Dead with Holy Eucharist will be celebrated for James Wesley Quillin at 11:00 AM on Saturday, May 29, 2021, in St. James Episcopal Church, with The Rt. Rev. Jacob W. Owensby, Ph.D.,D.D. and The Rev. Liz Ratcliff officiating. Entombment will follow in Mount Olivet Cemetery, Pineville, under the direction of John Kramer & Son Funeral Home.

Visitation will be held from 5:00 PM until 8:00 PM on Friday, May 28, 2021, at the funeral home and resume from 9:00 AM until the time of service on Saturday, May 29, 2021, at St. James Episcopal Church Parish Hall.

James is preceded in death by his father, Willard Quillin.

James Wesley Quillin was born in Waco, TX, in 1949, to Willard and Paulina Quillin. After a short stent in England during Willard's military service, he was raised in Pineville, LA, with his little sister, Susie. He attended Pineville High School and then Louisiana College, where he graduated in 1973 with a bachelor's degree in psychology. He obtained his master's degree in psychology at Northwestern State University in 1975. He obtained his doctorate degree in clinical psychology at the University of Southern Mississippi, graduating in 1978. He then completed a one-year psychology residency in Columbia, SC, at the William S. Hall Psychiatric Institute. In 1979, he started his private psychology practice in Pineville, LA. Soon after, he created his private psychological practice, Psychological Associates, in Alexandria, LA.

During his long professional career, he had the pleasure of treating thousands of patients in the central Louisiana area. He was published in multiple professional academic psychological journals, and for a brief period was an adjunct faculty member at Louisiana College. He has been a member of the Louisiana Academy of Medical Psychologists (LAMP) since 1979, and he served as the organization's president from 2000-2004. He also served as the president of the Louisiana Psychological Association from 2009-2010. Late in his career, he pioneered the movement for focused prescriptive authority to be granted to psychologists with additional training in neuroanatomy and psychopharmacology. He was in the first class of psychologists to meet these rigorous standards and successfully obtain the distinction of a medical psychology degree in Louisiana. He was instrumental in the passage of legislation through both the Louisiana

State House of Representatives and Louisiana Senate to allow this degree to exist, and for medical psychologists to practice at the top of their license. As a member of several national and Louisiana state professional organizations, he received multiple awards for his service to the field and his dogged pursuit of excellence. He was very dedicated to advancement of his field, and he actively practiced in the field of psychology for 42 years. He was an active member of St. James Episcopal Church. He joined the congregation at St. James in 2012 and received his confirmation in the St. James Episcopal Church in 2014. In his church service he was a member of the St. James vestry, where he most recently served as the senior warden until his death. He regularly ushered church services within his church family. Additionally, he served on the church Stewardship Committee for several years, and was a member of the Russell Knight Men's Bible Study Group. His civic involvements include serving on the board of the Rotary Club of Alexandria for several years, active membership in the Parlangua men's Mardi Gras Krewe, and serving as king of the Krewe of Twelfth Night.

He was a beloved husband, son, brother, father, grandfather, fisherman, duck hunter, poker player, dog lover, Mardi Gras krewe member, Christian, genealogist, Irishman, and patriarch. He was a native son of central Louisiana, taken too soon from the family, friends, and community he loved. He died peacefully at home surrounded by his loved ones.

Those left to cherish his memory include his wife, Paige Quillin; children, Drs. Elizabeth McLemore (Aaron); Rebecca Bartlett (Grant), Jennifer Andrus (Brandon), and Drs. Joseph Quillin (Thanmaya Reddy); sister, Susie Quillin (Russell Ward); mother, Paulina Ussery; grandchildren, Anna Kate Bartlett, Jack McLemore, Molly McLemore, Luke McLemore, Emily Bartlett, Addison Andrus, Jude Andrus, and Ruth Quillin.
